THE LOWDOWN ON FAMILIES WHO GET HIGH

This session will provide social workers with a greater understanding of the long term impact of addiction on parents/caregivers and their children, what children experience when an addict is their parent/caregiver, learn common issues with children of substance abuse, and the 12 step approach of parenting after & during recovery.

BULLYING AND VIOLENCE IMPOSED BY STUDENTS AT SCHOOL AND IN LOCAL COMMUNITIES

Objectives: The participants will be able to define bullying, understand the seriousness of acts of bullying and that it requires vigorous, sustained intervention as well as learn about successful bullying prevention programs via practicing techniques of collaboration and interaction between school and home.

Participants will have knowledge and understanding of the 6 main components of the MS Child Welfare Practice Model which includes: 1.Mobilizing appropriate services timely, 2.Safety assurance and risk management, 3.Involving children & families in case activities and decision making, 4.Strengths and needs assessments of children and families, 5.Preserving connections and relationships, 6.Individualized and timely case planning

SEXUALITY AND AGING, POLICY IMPLICATIONS FOR LONG TERM CARE

Attendees will gain increased awareness of dignity issues faced by residents in long term care facilities, specifically related to sexual activity, and need for staff training. Attendees will be able to identify policy needs regarding sexual activity of residents, including designation of time and place for privacy and specification of which residents are permitted to engage in sexual activity on premises.

ANIMAL ASSISTED THERAPY (AAT): BENEFITS AND ARENAS OF SERVICE

Participants will be able to identify patients/ clients who will benefit from AAT and how it can assist in recognizing and revealing diagnostic clues in assessment of patients/clients as well as realize the emotional and psychological benefits of AAT.

MISSISSIPPI POLICY DEVELOPMENTS
